Last Day of School

**The Last Day of School is Tuesday, June 4
Students are Dismissed at 12:30 p.m.**

The majority of students will be attending school until Tuesday, June 4 with an early dismissal time of 12:30 p.m. on that day.

- **4K:** The last day of school for 4K students is Monday, June 3.
- **Grades K-4:** On Tuesday, June 4, students in grades K-4 will be dismissed at 12:30 p.m. Buses will pick up students at that time. Please pay all fines/fees and return school materials before the end of the school year. Report cards will be mailed instead of being sent home with students. Watch for some important information included with report cards concerning the summer and next school year.
- **Middle School (grades 5-8):** Dismissal time for grades 5-7 will be at 12:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 4. Buses will transport students home at that time. Students in grade 8 will not attend school on June 4; their last day is Monday, June 3, which includes a class trip. All fines/fees must be paid and materials returned before the end of the school year. Report cards will be mailed. Watch for some important information included with report cards concerning the summer and next school year.
- **High School (grades 9-11):** Students will have classes as usual on Friday, June 4 with dismissal at 12:30 p.m. Buses will be at the school at that time. All fines/fees must be paid and materials returned before the end of the school year. Report cards will be mailed to parents.



- **Seniors graduate on Sunday, June 2.** Their last day is Friday, May 31 which includes mandatory graduation practice. All obligations should be taken care of prior to graduation.

community support, the School District of Poynette is now in a much stronger financial position which has allowed us to stay on track to meet the lofty goals laid out in the District's Strategic Plan.

We have been able to advance the goal of our first strategic plan pillar that focuses on preparing our students to be "Career, College, and Life Ready Graduates" through the strengthening of our academic and extracurricular programs, enabling our students to excel both inside and outside the classroom. I am proud to announce that this year, Poynette High School has been recognized by the U.S. News & World Reports as one of the nation's Top High Schools and Poynette Elementary School received the top distinction of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations" on their latest school report card. These recognitions are a testament to the dedication and hard work of our entire school community. The support from our community has played a pivotal role in our success, and I am immensely grateful for your continued commitment to supporting an exceptional school system.

The referendum has also helped us in supporting our

commitment to "Attracting and Retaining High Quality Staff" members, the second pillar of our strategic plan. With increased funding, we have been able to offer more competitive compensation packages, ensuring that we continue to have the best educators guiding our students toward success. 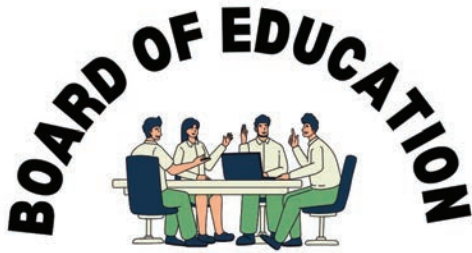

were seated at the April 22, 2024 Regular Board Meeting to start their three year term.

Board of Education meetings are held once a month, usually on the third Monday unless noted otherwise. School Board Committee meetings are also held monthly. There are three standing board committees: Facilities Committee, Curriculum Committee, and Policy/Finance Committee. Meeting schedules and agendas are posted on the school district website under the District tab, Board of Education

Meetings are open to the public and community member attendance is welcomed. Regular Board of Education Meeting agendas include a Community Forum time for members of the public to address the board for up to 3 minutes. Visitors must sign in prior to the beginning of the meeting. Individuals addressing the board during the Community Forum will be asked to state their name and address for public record The Board will listen to all concerns, but can only address an item if it appears on the agenda as part of that agenda item. There will be no discussion of personnel or individually named students.

4K Registration & 4K Screening

The Poynette School District is preparing for the 4K program in the fall of 2024-25 school year. Parents of children who will be four by September 1, 2024 are encouraged to enroll their children in the Four-Year-Old Kindergarten Program for Fall 2024.

To register your child, please call the Elementary School office at 608-635-4347, ext. 107 or 109, so we can mail the registration forms to you.

We will need to see your child's birth certificate to verify your child's name and date of birth, (required by the DPI) and a proof of residency (i.e. utility bill, phone bill etc).

**Note that your child must have a physical examination by his/her doctor before the first day of school in the fall, unless you have an appointment already scheduled at a later date.

Nurse's Report



Recognizing the symptoms of a concussion

With the winter season behind us, it is now time for children to get out and participate in outdoor physical activities such as bike riding, skateboarding, organized sports and playtime on swing sets/jungle gyms.

Play time is essential for children's development but it can also put children at risk of sustaining a head injury. The following are symptoms to be aware of if your child hits their head:

Physical	Cognitive	Emotional	Other
Intense headache	Difficulty remembering	Nervousness	Sleeping more or less than usual
Nausea/Vomiting	Feeling foggy	Sadness	A feeling of "just not feeling right"
Dizziness	Feeling like they are moving slow	Irritable

Sensitivity to light/sound			
Unequal pupils			

Your child should seek medical attention immediately if any of the 'red flag' symptoms occur:

- Loss of consciousness for more than one minute
- Increasing confusion or inability to stay awake
- Repetitive vomiting
- Seizure or convulsion
- Severe or increasing headache
- Severe neck pain
- Weakness, tingling, or burning in arms or legs
- Persistent double vision or loss of vision
- Increasingly restless, agitated, or combative

If your child is diagnosed with a concussion the following steps should be taken to ensure a full recovery:

- Reduce screen time from video games, television, tablets, phones and computers.
- Limited exposure to loud noises and bright lights.
- Get plenty of rest.
- Stay hydrated.
- Eat a diet high in protein along with fruits, vegetables and nuts.
- Take Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen as directed by your doctor.
- Follow your doctor's orders.

Counselor's Corner

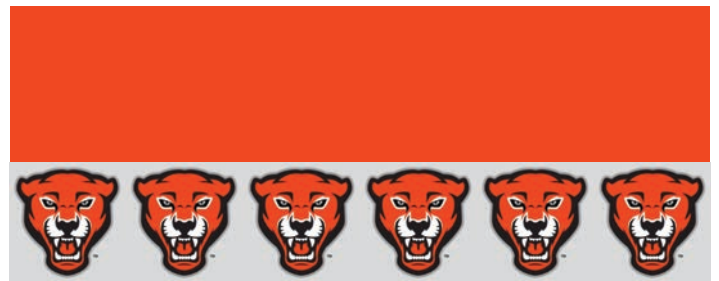


Hopefully, Juniors have been researching potential colleges they may want to apply to this fall; keep in mind that you will want to start the application process early in the fall (as early as August), so researching potential colleges now is a good idea. Additionally, summer can be a great time to complete that college application essay or personal statement; you will have more time over the summer than once school starts again next fall. The summer is also a great time to tour some of the campuses you may be interested in. Seniors, you still have time to complete the FAFSA. Remember, there is no deadline to file for financial aid, so go ahead and complete the FAFSA if you have not done so yet. All seniors planning to attend a college this fall need to request a final transcript be sent to that school. Most, if not all, colleges will require that the final transcript with your graduation date be on file (with them) for you to attend classes this fall. We will be reminding seniors of this toward the end of the year, but please give yourself a reminder to make sure this is requested. Making the final request for an official transcript is the student's responsibility. A Google form will be shared in May with Seniors to make this request.

Parents of incoming 9th and 11th graders (currently 8th and 10th), please be reminded of the Connections Conferences that will take place next school year. Counselors, Parents, and Students will meet individually to review student goals, planning for after high school, and prospective career plans. Counselors will begin scheduling these conferences in October; conferences will continue through January.

If any Students are interested in retaking the ACT this summer, they can get more information from the Counseling Office on how to register for a test date. Students can also register themselves through their MyACT account set up earlier this year.

High School students should receive their schedule for next year before the end of the school year. Incoming Freshmen will receive their class schedule at Freshman Orientation, tentatively scheduled for the week before school starts. You will receive more information with a specific date and time for Orientation. Students and Parents can view schedules through the Infinite Campus portal once the 2024-2025 school year calendar is open to the public upon completion of summer school.

Registration Information for All Poynette District Students 24-25 School Year - OPENS JULY 1, 2024

Registration will again be offered electronically (only) for the 24-25 school year. Registration information will be going out to families at the end of the school year for sign-up starting on July 1 and closing on July 31, 2024. Registration will be through the district website at www.poynette.k12.wi.us, Families & Community, Curriculum & Instruction, Registration Information.

Registration consists of the following items:

• Review/update household information on the Infinite Campus Parent Portal including household member names, household address, household member contact information, household member relationships*, and emergency contact information. If you do not have an Infinite Campus Portal account, please register for one on our website (see information on the district website).

• The annual REGISTRATION with Medical History and Emergency authorization form **MUST** be completed for **EACH STUDENT**. The link to complete this form can be found after June 30th as part of the registration instructions found on the district website at www.poynette.k12.wi.us, Families & Community, Curriculum & Instruction, Registration Information.

• Pay Student Fees - payment for student fees can be remitted after June 30th online via the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Checks for fall fees are accepted at any time after June 30th.

- Registration Fees
 - \$10 Registration Fee for Grades K - 4 (There is no fee for 4K students)
 - \$25 Registration Fee for Grades 5 - 12
- Athletic Fees - Athletic Fees are added to each student's account once they are signed up for a sport(s). Sign up for any middle school or high school athletics can be completed online.  - High School Athletic Fee - \$50 per sport season
 - Middle School Athletic Fee - \$25 per sport season
- Parking Permit Application (High School Only) - Fees are added to each student's account after the parking application form is completed and submitted. 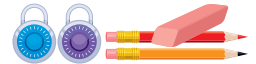

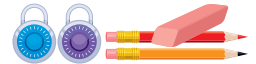

The FFA has been busy this season, fostering a strong sense of community while developing valuable skills in its members. Here's a glimpse into their recent activities.



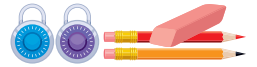
Poynette FFA

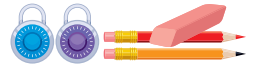

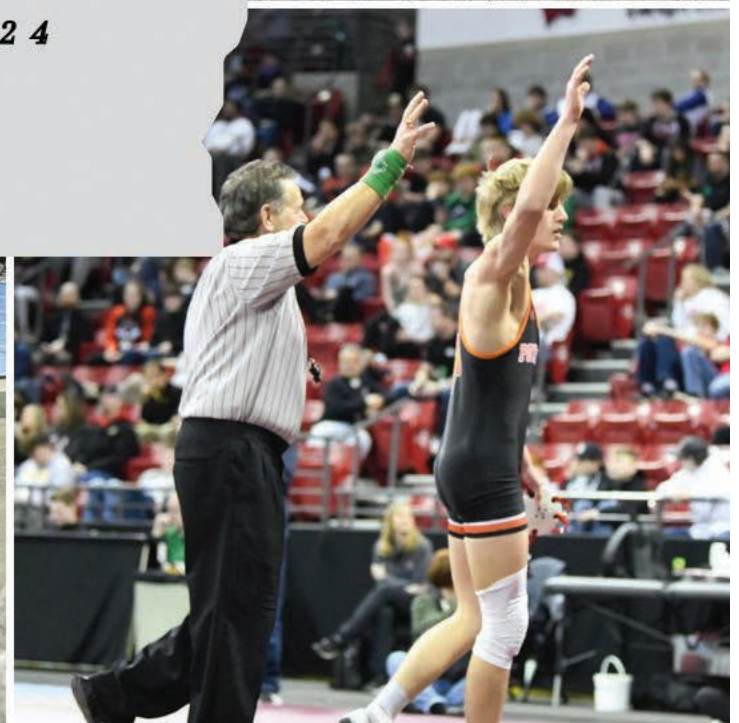

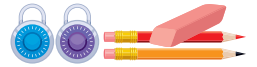
